## ***Need Copyright- and Royalty-Free Images?***

Everything you see on the Web is someone's property. If you don't have permission to use it, and if your presentation is going to be used many times or be published (and posting on D2L might well count as publishing) you'd better get permission. Fortunately, there are many places where you are a pre-approved user, including images created by the U.S. government (which are by definition in the public domain) and those in the databases to which the Metro State library subscribes, for example, Academic Search Premier (or pretty much any EBSCO database), Access Science, and Art Museum Image Gallery.

When you find a photo you like, check for details on what you can and can't do with it. Most licenses require that you give credit to the image creator when reusing an image.
